	Asian American	People whose ancestry is from one or more of the following Asian or South Asian countries: Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Brunei, Burma (or Myanmar), Cambodia, China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Kazakhstan, North Korea, South Korea, Kyrgyzstan, Laos, Malaysia, Maldives, Mongolia, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Tajikistan, Thailand, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, and Vietnam. Exclude all foreign nationals who do not hold an American citizenship or are not permanent residents of the United States.	
	Caucasian American	People whose ancestry is from one or more of the following European, Western, Eastern, or Mediterranean countries: Albania, Andorra, Armenia, Austria, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Macedonia, Malta, Moldova, Monaco, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, San Marino, Serbia and Montenegro, Slovakia (Slovak Republic), Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, and Vatican City. Exclude all foreign nationals who do not hold an American citizenship or are not permanent residents of the United States.	
	Latino/Hispanic American	People whose ancestry is from one or more of the following countries: Argentina, Belize, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, French Guyana, Guatemala, Guyana, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Perú, Puerto Rico, Surinam, Uruguay, and Venezuela. Exclude all foreign nationals who do not hold an American citizenship or are not permanent residents of the United States. Exclude people of Spanish ancestry.	

	Middle Eastern American	People whose ancestry is from one of the following countries: Bahrain, Egypt, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, United Arab Emirates, and Yemen. Exclude all foreign nationals who do not hold an American citizenship or are not permanent residents of the United States.			
	Multiracial American	People who identify with more than one ethnic/race heritage, and who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents of the United States.			
	Native American	People of American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleut ancestry.			
	Pacific Islander American	People whose ancestry is from one or more of the following areas: Hawaii, Australia, New Zealand, New Guinea.			
	International	People who are not U.S. citizens or are not permanent U.S. residents.			
	Unsure	Use this category if you do not know your racial identity.			
	Choose not to identify	Use this category if you choose not to identify your racial identity.
